On this the 10th day of April A.D., 2023 at 8:45 A.M. came on to be had a Public Hearing of the Commissioners' Court of Wise County, Texas held in the Justice of the Peace, Precinct No. 2 Courtroom (200 Rook Ramsey Drive, Decatur, TX) of said County in the town of Decatur with the following members present and presiding:

Action will be taken by the Wise County Commissioners' Court during the Regular scheduled meeting at 9:00 A.M., Monday, April 10, 2023.

This meeting is to discuss and receive comments for the sole purpose of conducting a public hearing pursuant to the Texas Transportation Code §251.152 on proposed order of the Commissioners' Court to restrict truck traffic on various roads in the Heritage Creek North Subdivision in Precinct #1, Wise County, Texas. The roads are Heritage Parkway, Heritage Parkway (East/West), Becca Ann Lane, Eric Ryan Lane, Timothy Lane and Vista Ridge North. At this time Judge Clark invited the public to voice their opinions on the matter.

Kristal Campbell expressed her concerns regarding truck traffic through the neighborhood. She alleges that the trucks are speeding, degrading the road, running stop signs, hauling hazardous and flammable materials, and running other trucks and cars off the road onto the grass shoulders. Campbell also brought letters from neighbors and photos for the court's record. (See attached)


Cheryl Montgomery adds she can't safely walk around her neighborhood for exercise because the trucks force her from the road and onto the grass shoulder.

Biff Hayes says that there is a county road on both sides of this residential neighborhood so restricting this pathway to these trucks does not create a huge detour for them.


Judge Clark points out that, as an incorporated county, it wouldn't be possible to restrict access to those roads if there weren't an alternate route.

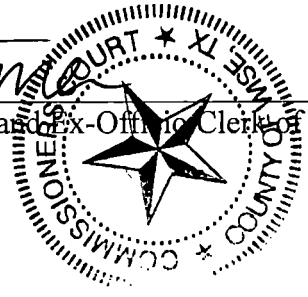
